





Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.**


Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive thosewho sin against us.


Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
