





We believe in one God,

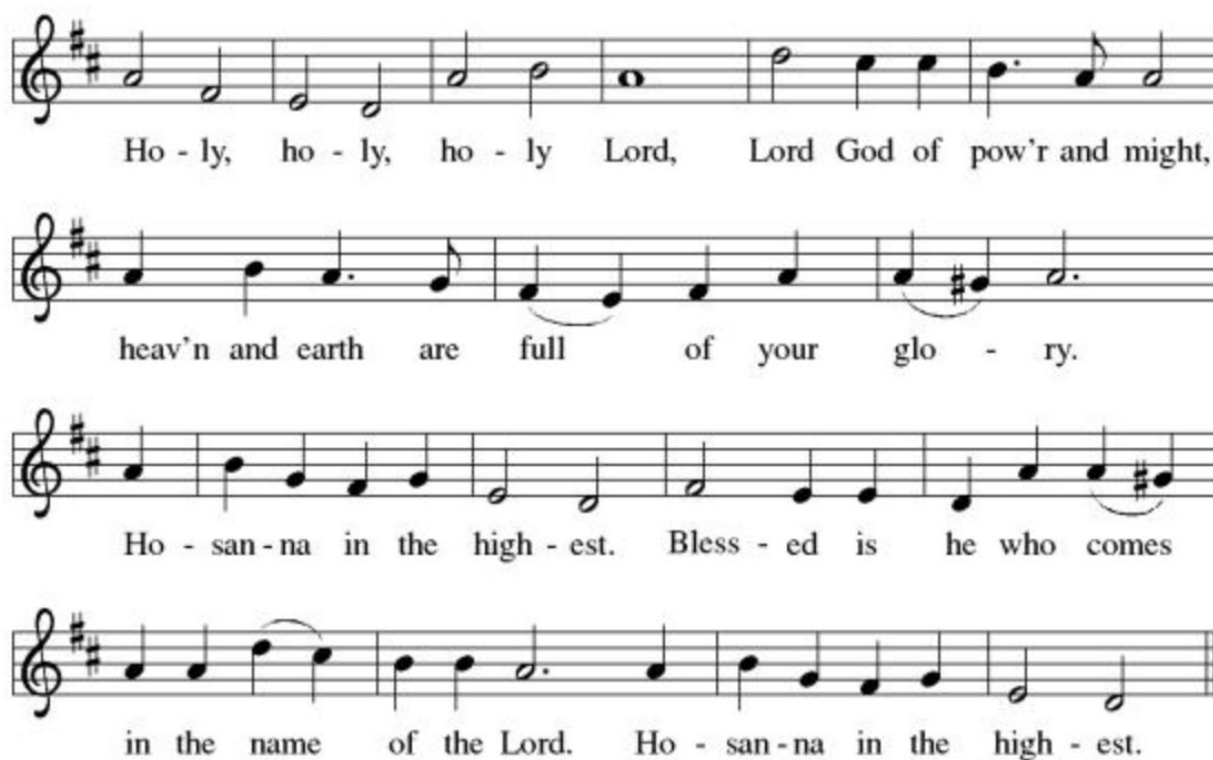

# Thanksgiving at the Table

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.**


